



Mr. Cody Yoshio Andrade

May 8, 1955 - May 1, 2023

Cody Yoshio Andrade was born on May 8, 1955 and passed away on May 1, 2023 surrounded by his loved ones. Cody leaves behind the love of his life, Josie, his children Joshua and Monse, his grandchildren, Austin, Dahlia, and Amelia, his great grandchild, Greyson, his four-legged babies he so lovingly referred to, family, and countless friends. Born in Hawaii to David Herman and Lorraine Yukie Andrade, he was the second oldest of three brothers. The family moved to Sonoma County, California in 1971, making Sebastopol their home.

In 1973 after graduating from Analy High School in Sebastopol, Cody enlisted in the United States Air Force Reserve. He did Basic and Security Police training at Lackland AFB in Texas. He was stationed at Hamilton AFB and in 1975 Cody re-enlisted into active duty with the United States Air Force. After further training, he became an Air Passenger Specialist and transferred to McGuire AFB in New Jersey and additionally became a member of the Honor Guard. Throughout his years of service, he was continuously praised and recognized for his achievements. The following are a few of many he received:

to be one of our finest workers when dealing with the public. He takes pride in helping others. He can express himself or establish rapport with customers even under the most difficult circum-stances.

There are not enough superlatives which would accurately describe Cody Andrade. In my opinion he is one of the most polite and courteous individuals assigned to this organization. His appearance and neatness has continuously set an example for other military members to follow. The image he reflects and the manner in which he conducts his public relations duties for Passenger Service makes him a highly qualified Passenger Service Representative. In November 1979, Cody Y. Andrade, SGT USAF was honorably discharged from the United States Air Force. He used the skills gained during his service and pursued the passion that he had as a young child which was a career in Law Enforcement. In 1981, after endless hours of training and education, he began working for the Department of Defense Housing Facility at Hamilton Airfield in Novato, where he continued to be praised and recognized for his achievements:

In 1988, Cody began working for Korbel Champagne Cellars. Little did he know then that his tenure would last thirty-four years. He began his career as a security officer, but eventually his tremendous work ethic, professionalism and dedication earned him a promotion to Chief Security Officer where he oversaw the security department. Korbel opened many doors for him but most importantly, it is where he met Josie, his best friend who in time would become his wife. They married on the big island of Hawaii, a place he held dear to his heart. Cody and Josie’s love for each other never wavered; it only grew stronger with each passing year. It was a privilege to witness their interactions, to watch the two of them and feel their mutual love and respect.

In 2017, Cody, founded the Cody Y. Andrade Firearms Instruction LLC; where he provided instruction in Basic Firearms, Law Enforcement Handgun/Shotgun, Bureau of Security and Investigative Services Firearms, CCW Permit Handgun Instruction and Certification. He was a frequent helper with various programs, such as Women on Target, and helped countless gun owners learn to carry their firearms properly and safely by passing on his knowledge to those fortunate enough to have trained with him.

While we are thankful for the beautiful memories we made with Cody over the years, he will be greatly missed, as his loss leaves a deep void in our hearts. However, we believe he will continue to guide us, protect us, and love us from

afar until our time comes to see him again.

Cody's family will host a service at the Church of Jesus Christ Latter-Day Saints at 8100 Valentine Ave, Sebastopol, CA 95472 on Thursday, May 11th. There will be a public viewing at 3:30pm with a service following at 5:00pm. Light refreshments will follow.

As a veteran of the United States Air Force, Cody will be laid to eternal rest at the Sacramento Valley National Cemetery. In his honor, full military honors will be rendered at 5810 Midway Rd, Dixon CA 95620 on May 18th at 11:00am. All are welcome to attend and if you wish to join us in procession from Windsor Healdsburg Mortuary and Crematory, please arrive no later than 8:45am.

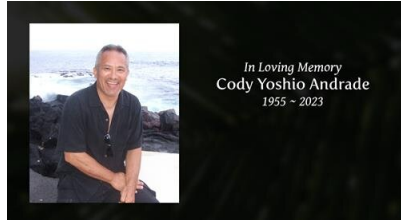
